



Laetare Sunday and the Liturgical Environment

"And when they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples..."

Matthew 21:1

The fourth Sunday of Lent is when we are "cresting the hill" on our way to Jerusalem with Jesus, and it is

now coming into our sight. Laetare Sunday comes from the Latin entrance antiphon, "Laetare Jerusalem: et conventum facite omnes qui diligitis eam", meaning "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and come together all you who love her."

The traditional vesture colour is rose, but is not a requirement so purple may be used. Flowers are permitted on this Sunday to symbolize our anticipation of spring and hope, so you will see some in the sanctuary for Laetare Sunday weekend (maybe roses!).

The display of the flowers will be simple, limited to Laetare Sunday, since our time on the "crest" will be short and Palm Sunday soon will be here.
