
HOLY TRINITY CATHOLIC CHURCH

Palm Sunday and the Liturgical Environment

"Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion!...Behold, your king comes to you, triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey..." Zechariah 9:9

Palm Sunday (also known as Passion Sunday) is the last Sunday of Lent and marks the

beginning of Holy Week. There are some familiar liturgical symbols used for this special day: the colour red, the palms, the decorated processional cross, and this year, some small branches of pussy willows.

The use of palms was first recorded sometime in the 4th century, as early Christians sought to reenact Christ's Passion and unite themselves more closely to our Lord's suffering. The palms commemorate when the crowds cut palms and small branches from the trees and laid them on the road as a sign of respect to celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Within a week, the cheers of "hosanna" would turn into jeers of "crucify!"

During Holy Week, may we draw closer to our Lord, may we spend "one hour" with Him.
