

Lenten Veiling: Why Are the Statues Covered?

By the waters of Babylon, there we sat down and wept, when we remembered Zion. On the willows there we hung up our lyres. Psalm 137:1-2

The Lenten practice of veiling statuary is to evoke the image of exile. Since the time of our exile from paradise, the veil has kept us from seeing heaven. Lenten veiling deprives us from those images that may bring us comfort and invites us to have sorrow for sin.

One of the possible origins of Lenten veiling has its source in the Middle Ages, when the cross usually was quite ornate with jewels and bright embellishments. As a result, during Lent it was covered as a sign of penitence. Additionally, the covering of statues may have its origins as being symbolic of "sack cloth and ashes".

It was a common practice to veil statuary in the church for the entire Lenten season prior to the 1960s. In 1985, the sacramental practice was revised to introduce the option to veil statuary during the last two weeks of Lent. Therefore, the statues of Our Lady and St Joseph will be veiled starting the April 5th weekend and the candles next to them will be removed for that period for safety. We invite you to use the votive prayer candles at the entry of the church during this time.

The main cross (sanctuary crucifix) and the processional cross also will be veiled during the last two weeks of Lent. The exception is Palm Sunday when the processional cross will be uncovered and decorated for Palm Sunday Mass, and then covered again for Holy Week.
